



The Baltimore Oriole, once seen in its brilliant orange, black, and white plumage, is never forgotten. The female's color is a dull orange. They come to the eastern states and southern Canada in late spring. Orioles feed and nest in large shade trees, especially elms. Their food is mostly insects. In September the Baltimore Orioles fly back to Central America to spend the winter.

The Oriole's nest, hangs from the end of a branch. The nest swings in the wind, but is fastened tight and does not fall off. Four to six white, blotched eggs are laid.
