



Barn Owls live in barns, old buildings, towers, hollow trees, and even in burrows in the ground. The female does not build a nest. It lays its five to eleven white eggs in a hollow or cranny in a building.

Barn Owls live in nearly every state. Most fly south for the winter. Like all Owls, the Barn Owl is a night bird. It sleeps during the day and comes out at night to hunt for rats, mice, and small birds. All Owls have excellent eyesight and hearing. Their flight is silent because their wing feathers are downy, and shorter and rounder than those of other birds.
